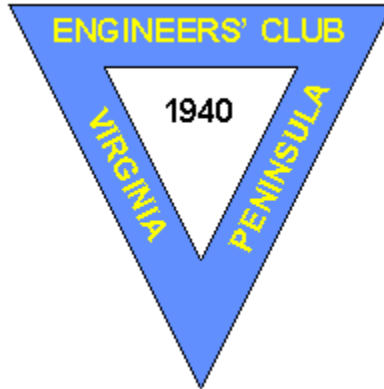

Speaker: *John Asby*, graduated the NNS apprentice school, and then went on to a BS in Electrical Engineering from ODU. CCA Marine designs systems, builds control panels and develops software for control systems on board marine vessels. The normal system would use computer graphics to animate the particular system at the operator level. These systems would employ state of the art fiber communications and networking and would also use sophisticated redundancy schemes. These systems are used on large private marine vessels as well as various Naval ships and subs.

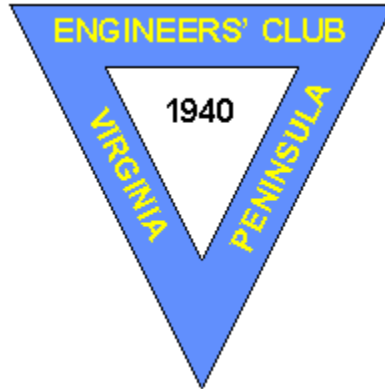

"Crabtree Collection of Miniature Ships"

Speaker: *Vincent Scott, is a docent of the Newport News Mariners' Museum .*

Abstract: *His presentation describes the development of a magnificent collection of sixteen miniature hand-carved vessels. The collection reflects 28 years of intensive effort by artist-carver August F. Crabtree, where each vessel was constructed in the same way as its full-size counterpart. Many of these vessels are decorated with exquisitely detailed carvings, and most of them are built to a scale of 1/4 inch to the foot.*

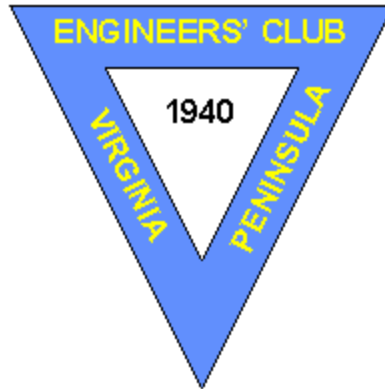

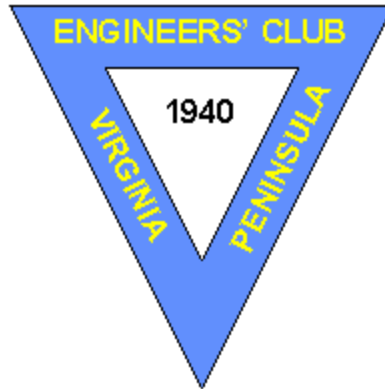

Location: *pick up the bus at Patrick Henry Mall, Newport News, near "Outback's".*

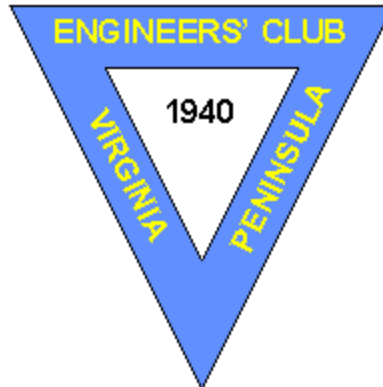
Times: *The bus will depart at 8:00 AM, and return at about 4:00 PM*
