



This version of the K2P1 is the e-wrapped one. The same pegs are wrapped and skinned but the wraps are all done with an e-wrapping.

For this stitch I used the figure eight cast on for the baby afghan I am working. You could use the long tail or lucet, but remember on the top row you will only be casting on every other peg. This illustration has no cast on row as I wanted you to see the first wrapping by itself.

When wrapping the next row follow the exact same path as the first row was wrapped. This is a very easy stitch to learn and it works up quickly.



With the K2P1 wrap the purl row wraps one peg, skips the next peg. While the knit side row has no skipped pegs in this version.

I turned the loom upside down as it was easier to see how this version wraps. You can see that you have to wrap two pegs at once around for the Knit two pegs, while the knit one peg is wrapped just as if it was the stockinette stitch.



This is the K2 P1 wrap without the twist. To do this wrap you wrap around the two pegs for the knitted side and one peg for the purl side. Do not e-wrap these. As you can see from the picture there the top pegs are both wrapped at the same time.

Another picture showing the wrap around with no twist for this stitch.
