ENROLLMENT PROCEDURE

Complete the application form and return it with the full fee required to the address indicated on the form. The fee is non-refundable unless accompanied by a doctor's note due to a medical emergency. **All returned checks are subject to an additional \$20 fee.

HOUSING & FOOD

Camper will live on the University of Oklahoma campus in University Housing under the supervision of camp staff. All meals will be provided at a university cafeteria under the direction of a licensed dietitian.

SOFTBALL GEAR
