Thank you for the inquiry. We pride ourselves in breeding exhibition quality call ducks. The majority of our breeders are show quality birds. Here is some information:

- We sell mature calls, no ducklings or eggs.
- Birds are sold in pairs. Single drakes are usually available at reasonable prices. Single hens are rarely available, but sometimes may be purchased for the price of a pair.
- Birds are usually available starting in late June. The best quality birds are not available until October or November.
- We can ship or we can deliver to shows that we attend throughout the great lakes region.
- Shipping charges depend on the number of birds shipped and the size box used. We charge only our estimated cost for USPS and the box, no additional shipping fees. If we overestimate shipping charges by more than a dollar or two, we will send a refund.
- Generally speaking, it costs approximately \$55 (shipping and box) to ship a pair of calls.
- A 25% non-refundable down payment is required with an order. If we are unable to fill your order in a particular year, it will carry forward to the following year. (This has not happened yet – we try to be careful when accepting orders.)
- Quality class (and pricing) of birds is totally subjective and by our discretion.
- We do not return long distance phone calls. E-mail is the quickest way to correspond if possible.

This is a rough idea of how we define the quality classes:

PET ~ While these birds do come from show quality bloodlines and will breed and produce offspring, they are not likely to produce offspring which are breeder or better quality. These birds are not likely to be placed at any show and in some cases may possess color disqualifications.

BREEDER ~ These birds are suitable for breeding and possess characteristics which make it at least somewhat likely that they will produce better quality birds. They possess no disqualifying color features and can be shown. They may place at smaller 4-H or junior shows but are not likely to place a larger open competition shows.

SHOW ~ The best quality birds which we offer and the most limited in quantity. These birds will fare well in open competition shows and are the most likely to produce good quality young.
