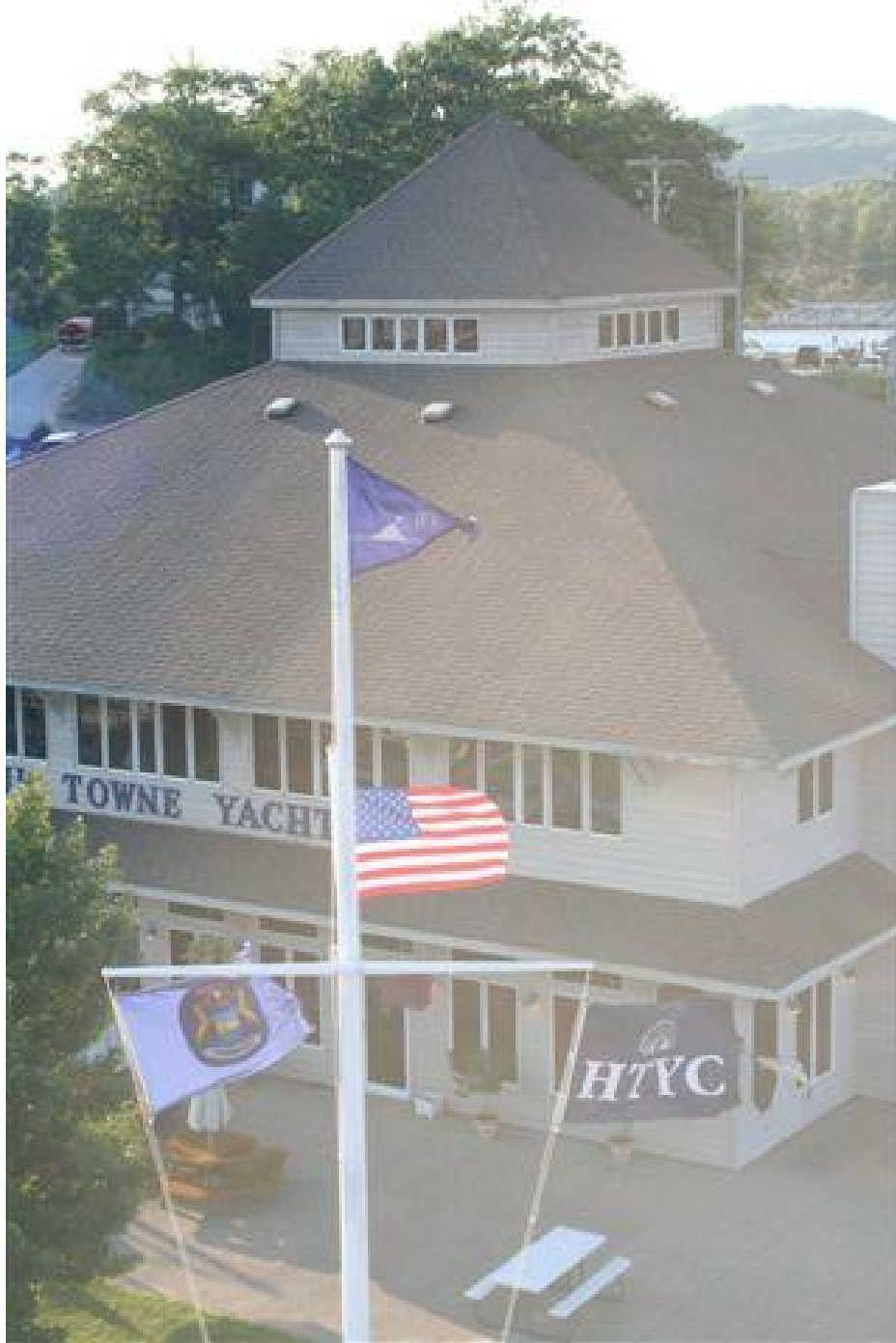

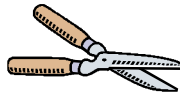

Fleet Captain of Sail

Warm weather is here and the boatyards are filled with boaters working on their boats. Listed here are upcoming events you will want to check out for this season:

May 17-18 – For this weekend, plan for a shakedown cruise to Grand Haven (power and sail) where a Jazz Festival is scheduled. They have new docks at the Municipal.

May 24 – For sailboat racers, this is the startup date for the Spring series at MYC

June 19 – Doublehanders, this is the date for the race from Muskegon to Port Washington. Get your entry information online at: www.lmsonline.com.

July 19 – Chicago-Mac race will see more boats on the water than ever before, with the final cutoff at 470 boats this year.

August 8 – Don't forget, this is our Clipper Cup date. HTYC to PWYC applications are at the HTYC website: www.htyc.com; or stop by the club and pick one up.

Getting ready for this year's sailing season, I was reminded of the Mac race in 2006. We were approaching the Manitou Islands during the second day. It was around midnight and I was at the helm of Bravo, a Taylor 40, with extreme weather conditions of 6-8 foot seas, and wind speed of 25-30 knots.

Approaching south Manitou Island, there were about 150 boats all around us as we moved at 10 to 12 knots. Here we are, rocking and rolling in the middle of the night, and we had to jibe in order to make the Manitou Passage. For beginners, this meant we had to move the spinnaker and pole from port to starboard. We had two men on foredeck and two men at the pole controls. With a 60 foot mast the spinnaker is huge.

The jibe order was given and while moving the pole over, the end cap came off the carbon fiber pole. The foredeck men used a marlinspike and blasted a hole in the carbon fiber pole.

Wow!! Now, we need a snatch block so we can re-run the spinnaker sheet (guy) and Speedy Nick was there in a flash. This Jerry-rig lasted until the end of the race, and it was instrumental in securing our first place finish in section.

All our races aren't as exiting, but they leave us with memories we never forget. Good luck to all of you this season.

And a final note ... If you would like to work on the Clipper Cup Committee, contact Dirk Buttke or me. Also, check out the signup sheets at the club for those who don't have a boat, but would like to sail, or for those with a boat who need help with crew.

HTYC POOL AREA POLICY

Purpose: The purpose of these regulations is to ensure the health, safety and comfort of all members.

Background: The pool area is operated in conformity with State and Local laws for cleanliness and conduct. Our pool area is equipped with up-to-date technology and is carefully operated to ensure the health of our members and guests. Observance of these regulations and procedures will serve to maintain our high standards for quality, cleanliness, and safety.

The Club staff, manager, House Committee, and HTYC Board of Directors are charged with the responsibility of ensuring all regulations and procedures are carefully and thoroughly carried out. They are authorized to forbid the use of the pool area for any infractions, subject to review by the Commodore and the Board of Directors.

EVERY PRECAUTION HAS BEEN TAKEN FOR THE SAFETY OF ALL PERSONS USING THE POOL; HOWEVER, THE HARBOUR TOWNE YACHT CLUB, ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS, COMMODORE AND EMPLOYEES ASSUME NO RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE SAFETY OF ANYONE USING THE POOL AREA OR FOR THEFT OR DAMAGE OF ANY PERSONAL PROPERTY.

USE OF THE POOL

- ✓ **Family Use** - The HTYC 'vertical bloodline' rules will apply for pool area visits by other family members -- grandparents, parents, children, stepchildren and grandchildren may use the pool area at no charge an unlimited number of times when accompanied by the member or co-member.
- ✓ **Guests** - Any other guests may use the pool area for a fee of three dollars per day. All guests must be accompanied by the member or co-member while in the pool area and the member or co-member will be responsible for all conduct of the guests while in the pool area.
- ✓ **Member Private Parties** - Members' private parties in the pool area are welcome during off-club hours and must be pre-arranged with the club manager. All guests must be accompanied by the member or co-member while in the pool area and the member or co-member will be responsible for all conduct of the guests while in the pool area.
- ✓ **Children Under 14 Years** - Must be attended by the member or a designated responsible adult physically present in the pool area at all times. Parents/adults taking children into the pool with them assume full responsibility for their safety and must supervise them at all times.
- ✓ **Pool Hours** - The pool area will be open to members of Harbour Towne Yacht Club from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. daily during the normal summer season. These hours are designed to coincide with Harbour Towne Marina quiet hours of 11:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m.
- ✓ **Swimming Lessons** - The club manager may schedule swimming lessons for the general public. The lessons will be scheduled for off-peak times and will require a Certified Life Guard/Water Swim Instructor to teach the class.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION TO THE POOL AREA

- ✓ All guests must pay the required fee to a staff member during normal hours. If the club is closed, the fee should be enclosed in an envelope (available in the mailbox on the pump room door) with the member's name printed on the outside and placed in the door mail slot.
- ✓ State law requires a shower with soap before entering the pool or hot tub. An outdoor shower has been installed for this purpose.
- ✓ The pool and hot tub are restricted to use by those who are thoroughly clear and free of disease, colds, cuts, sores, bandages, infections, skin eruptions, or any other evidence of a physical condition which may be considered potentially harmful to others. A doctor's certificate may be requested by HTYC in questionable cases.
- ✓ The pool and hot tub are restricted to use by those who are thoroughly clear and free of disease, colds, cuts, sores, bandages, infections, skin eruptions, or any other evidence of a physical condition which may be considered potentially harmful to others. A doctor's certificate may be requested by HTYC in questionable cases.
- ✓ Members may not loan their pool card to anyone.
- ✓ All club members are provided with an "active" pool access card. Do not open the locked gate for someone unless you are sure of their "active" status.

POSTED POOL AREA RULES

- ✓ Do not spit, spout water, or pollute the water.
- ✓ Do not enter the club without additional attire - **shoes and shirt are required.**
- ✓ Drinks consumed on club property must be purchased from the club.
- ✓ Glass containers, chewing gum, and chewing tobacco are not allowed anywhere within the pool enclosure.
- ✓ Pets are not permitted within fenced pool and deck area.
- ✓ Loud noise is prohibited.
- ✓ Running, pushing, shoving, and horseplay are prohibited.
- ✓ **No diving is allowed.**
- ✓ Your trash is your responsibility. Properly dispose of all cans, plastic cups and litter you create.
- ✓ Food is not allowed while in the pool or hot tub.
- ✓ **No glass is allowed within the pool enclosure.**
- ✓ If you smoke, use ashtrays or sand pots provided.
- ✓ Doors and gates must not be propped open.
- ✓ If a child is not "completely" potty-trained, swimmyies must be worn. They are available in a ladies rest room locker, at the bar or bring your own.
- ✓ Please cover the hot tub and pool if you are the last to leave.
- ✓ Report all injuries immediately.
- ✓ In the event of a pool emergency or concern, please call:

“We Really Need You”!

Lawn Maintenance: We need a volunteer(s) to cut our grass with our new electric start riding lawn mower and edge the areas with a gas-powered trimmer once a week. The areas needing attention are:

- lower level lawn off the south patio
- area in front of the north Harbour View Room entrance
- small north strip between the parking lot and the sidewalk



We estimate that this activity will take less than 30 minutes to complete. You may perform this weekly task by yourself or in concert with others.

Pool Maintenance: We have three teams (two members each) that take care of all the pool needs (examples: chemical maintenance, shower room/restroom maintenance and supplies and pool deck neatness). These daily activities take about 20 minutes a day for a team to complete, and are routinely completed in the morning hours, but could be completed later if the team so chooses. Each team works for a one-week period, every 3RD week. We have one volunteer who has already responded and is looking for a partner. We provide the training and have additional help until the team is confident to assume this responsibility without monitoring. Additional help is always a phone call away!

Flowers & Shrubs: Green thumb friends are needed to keep our plants alive and flourishing. We have help available to assist in setting a schedule of what needs to be done when. All we need are caring friends to make it happen on a regular scheduled basis. We estimate this task would take about 40 minutes total per week.
